PRESIDENT'S REPORT

SONDRA ANDERSON

The year started off a little rocky as WA opened up to the rest of Australia and the World! With the support of our Club Presidents, the first five weeks of the season saw a flexible fill-in policy introduced so all teams could continue playing instead of forfeiting.

Bethan, our Association Umpire
Development Officer, consulted to
develop an umpire pool concept to assist
Clubs in fielding umpires when they were
impacted by illness in the first weeks of the
competition. This too was a success.

I would like to thank everyone for their effort in making this season possible. The rest of the season played out in the traditional way, although it did feel harder than the previous two years. Let's hope that in 2023 we can get back to the netball we know and love. I was so proud of our community, and how everyone came together and enjoyed being back at netball with their friends and family.

We were finally able to resurface Courts 1 to 3 and have new lighting poles installed, which means that all of our hard courts are now lit. Thank you to the Netball WA Community Facilities Fund, Club Night Lights Program, and Josh Wilson Stronger Communities for their contributions. We also added resurfacing of the run-off to the west of Court 3 thanks to the Netball WA Community Facilities Fund, helping to make the surface safer.

Special presentations were made at the AGM: Sandra Doherty received Honorary Life Membership, Sondra Anderson received Life Membership, and Milly Perica was acknowledged for her 25 years of volunteer service at FNA.



Bev Buswell from Palmyra Rebels Netball Club was awarded one of the Netball WA Service to Sport Awards this year after 2021 marked 60 years volunteering at FNA.

We tried something new in June with a social night, with a band, food trucks and Kidz n Sport (to keep the young ones busy) after our regular Saturday fixture. This was a successful community event, but we just needed the weather to be kinder – maybe 2023. We raffled a Golden Parking Ticket at the event, and Jen Donovan of Winthrop Netball Club was the winner. Walking Netball was also played during the night, which was thoroughly enjoyed by all.

We continued our sponsorship with Brilliance Removalist & Storage as a GOLD sponsor. Thank you to Gold Industry Group who re-covered all of our post protectors in agreement with Netball WA. We successfully applied for \$2,000 from Sport and Recreation COVID-19 Cleaning Subsidy supported by Lotterywest.

The Life Members' morning tea was able to take place in 2022, albeit with a very restricted invitee list due to COVID-19.

Our FNA School Holiday Clinic was held on 4 and 5 July, with 223 participants attending, aged between 5 and 12 years. A School Holiday Umpire Clinic was also held on 5 July. Both of these were a success despite the rainy weather.



A total of 458 teams registered for the Winter Competition in 2022. We welcomed two new Clubs – Manaia Netball Club and Kaos Netball Club – and both were very competitive and fitted right in. We conducted a pilot Junior Mixed Short Season Competition for 2022.

Congratulations to Attadale Netball Club who won both Senior A1 and Junior A1 – this is the first time since 1965 that a Club has won both grades in the same year.

Congratulations to our FNA players selected in the 2022 State Squads for 17U and 19U that travelled to Hobart, Tasmania in April. Sophie Eastaugh (St Christopher's Netball Club) was selected for the All Australia U19 Team and named Captain.

Congratulations to Christine Johnstone for umpiring at the National Netball Championships and the Australian Netball Championships and also being named Netball WA WANL umpire of the year. Congratulations to Madison Rogers for officiating at the U15 State School Girls Competition.

Our FNA umpires were awarded 41
National C Badges and three National B
Badges. Eight FNA umpires were a part of
the WANL State Umpire squad: Jerome
Gillbard, Christine Johnstone, Jenna Muir,
Claire Ryan, Madison Rogers, Dana Gibaut,
Fiona Carpenter and Bethan Duffill.

Jerome Gillbard was invited into the Australian Umpire Development Pool and after playing at Men's and Mixed Nationals, was invited into the Opens National Men's Playing Squad.

FNA participated in a Pre-Association Champs Carnival held with PNA in March, which was very well received by all who were able to attend. FNA's Association Championships Teams had a successful weekend, with 18 teams representing the Association, plus two teams from Fremantle All Abilities Netball Club in the No Limits division. 11 teams made Finals, and we came home with five wins. Netball WA changed the age groups in 2022, dropping 15U and 17U and adding the 16U age group. This led to FNA taking five 16U teams, including an East Freo Sharks Academy team. Thank you to Happy Feet Children's Footwear who supplied gift vouchers for the Most Valuable Player award recipient for each Association Championship team.

The Fever in Time Program, run by Netball WA, replaced Metro League in 2022. The Associations were grouped into regions (Central, North, South). FNA was part of the South region, along with Success, Belmont and Rockingham Districts Netball Associations. Players were talent identified by Netball WA selectors from March to June at the WANL Developing Talent Challenge carnivals held in the regions and at the Gold Netball Centre, as well as the Association Championships carnival. A fivesession training program was run, with teams competing at State Cup in October. Compared to the former Metro League competition, Fever in Time allowed for far fewer players to be involved at a higher level of development.

Three FNA coaches were successful in applying for coaching positions within this new structure: Ally Castley (Attadale Netball Club) as the 16U1 Assistant Coach, Zoe Spencer (Cockburn Netball Club) as the 14U1 Coach, and Trudy Cammell (Palmyra Netball Club) as the 14U2 Coach.

FNA was well represented at State Cup, with the bulk of the players in the Metro South 16U1, 16U2, and 14U1 teams being FNA athletes.



Congratulations to Madison Reid, Bethany Savage, Jessica Phillips and Grace Ellis for participating in the Fever in Time Umpire Program, and Bethan Duffill and Christine Johnston who were appointed as coaches. Bethany Savage officiated the 20U Grand Final, and was awarded the Emerging Umpire Award.

The 20U team who competed at the Association Championships and Metro Development Program & Carnival represented FNA at State Cup, which was held from 7 to 9 October 2022. The Coach was Zoran Panzich (Tingara Netball Club), with assistant coach Deb Librizzi (Kardinya Netball Club), and Janelle Mudie (Dalmatinac Netball Club) as team manager. They were undefeated in their pool and won their Grand Final against Wanneroo, 44 goals to 41.

The Association participated in the Metro Development Program & Carnival, which was an initiative between FNA, Perth Netball Association & Wanneroo Districts Netball Association, aimed at further engaging those athletes who were not selected by Netball WA for Fever in Time.

We submitted two 14U teams, two 16U teams, and one 20U team, and players were selected from the Association Championships squad lists. Teams from six Associations across the Perth metropolitan region competed.



Injuries really impacted the 2022 GIG WANL Season for East Freo Sharks Netball, with the Open team finishing 6th and the 20 & Under team finishing 5th. FNA and Peel Lightning athlete Ava Robson (St. Christopher's) received the WANL 20U Fairest & Best award.

East Freo Sharks Netball signed a five year licence agreement, including a possible two year extension. Sharks proposed that in order to better integrate Sharks into the FNA pathway and bring in greater sponsorship opportunities for the Sharks, that the administration of Sharks be brought into the FNA office. FNA proposed that, in addition to this, the WANL licence also be transferred to FNA and a subcommittee be established to deal with the ongoing management of the Club.

We held our twelfth annual Club Forum. It was very well attended meeting, with robust discussion and exchange of ideas on all matters at FNA. Thank you to Tingara for coordinating the pre-Club Forum meeting.

It was another successful Spring Netball season under lights with music. Our traditional Wednesday night Spring competition was even more popular than last year, with 150 teams participating, and was open to mixed teams for all grades.

Thank you to our office staff - Michelle Wilshaw (Finance), Bethan Duffill (AUDO), Gayle Passmore (ADO), Kate Bond (Registrar), and Keryn Rae and Adam Bond (Administration). I thank all of our Committee and other Association and Club volunteers for your ongoing support and contribution to the Association.

We had 458 teams registered to participate in the Winter Competition for 2022, with almost 4200 playing members taking part in the season. We ran a pilot Junior Mixed Competition, with two teams taking part from Leeming Netball Club and Melville Lakers Netball Club.

We had 34 clubs participate in our Winter competition, of which 20 clubs won at least one premiership. Attadale Netball Club was our most successful club with 10 premierships. Attadale won both the SAI division and the Junior AI Grand Final.

The most valuable player in the SA1 Grand Final was Lizzy Hughes from Attadale Netball Club, and the most valuable player in the Junior A1 Grand Final was Milly Sullivan from Palmyra Rebels Netball Club.

• Open division: 32 teams


• 17U division: 24 teams

GAYLE PASSMORE

We had a very rewarding year with our development and representative programs at FNA in 2022.

ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS

We had a successful weekend, with 18 teams representing FNA, plus two No Limits teams from our Fremantle All Abilities Netball Club. Eleven teams made Finals and we came home with five premierships.

Sharnie Bridge and Gwenllian Fisher (12U Team 4 athletes) were the flag bearers for FNA at the opening ceremony.

METRO DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM CARNIVAL

The Metro Development Program Carnival (MDPC) was a multi-Association initiative, held in place of the now-discontinued Metro League. 19 teams competed at Wanneroo Districts NA, including a mixed team from Kalamunda & Districts NA. FNA expects to host this carnival in 2023 and aims to make it the development carnival of choice for athletes, coaches, and umpires.

FEVER IN TIME & STATE CUP

State Cup was played at Perth Netball Association on the 7th to 9th of October as the culmination of Netball WA's Fever in Time program. FNA athletes made up most of the 16U and 14U squads in the Metro South region, and we also saw excellent coaching representation.

Associations were able to enter a team into the 20 & Under division, and our team from Association Championships and the MDPC represented FNA. The team remained undefeated in their pool, and won the Grand Final against WDNA 44-41. WANL clubs were present for talent identification of athletes during the event.

COACHING DEVELOPMENT

FNA saw three coaches attain their Intermediate Coach Accreditation - congratulations to Janelle Mudie (Dalmatinac), Nikki Vidal (Dalmatinac), Sue McLennan-Atkins (Attadale) - as well as 11 achieving their Development Coach Accreditation. We ran a number of very successful coaching and selecting development initiatives, and look forward to even greater success in this area in 2023.

UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT REPORT

JUNIOR UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

This season, 30 beginner umpires participated in the Junior Umpire Development Program (JUDP) that was efficiently run by Erica Miglori and her team of umpire coaches. There were a record 12 National C badges awarded during this program, and four umpires were elevated into our 2022 Umpire Academy group. In October and November, we saw over 65 umpires trial for our 2023 program, which we plan to expand.

ADULT UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

In its inaugural year, we saw six umpires participate in the Adult Umpire Development Program. This program is targeted at umpires of any level who are over the age of 18, and is aimed at giving people a safe and structured place to learn how to umpire or progress their umpiring skills. In 2022, we had participants who had never umpired before, and umpires who officiated SA1 and SA3 games. We plan to continue this program into 2023.

UMPIRING WORKSHOPS

In 2022, the Umpire Committee and Squad delivered five workshops, and visited two Clubs, to upskill umpires in different areas of netball, including rules discussion, game management and umpire coaching. Netball WA also delivered a rules workshop and visited the Association once on a match day to coach and talent identify umpires. These activities were all successful and we plan to expand on these in 2023.
