PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It felt like every team in the competition had fill ins this year, but all of our Clubs persisted nonetheless for a successful season.

COMMITTEE & VOLUNTEERS

We welcomed Narelle Morgan to the Representative Teams Coordinator role, also joining the Pathways Subcommittee, to work on the integration of Sharks and the FNA development pathway. We sadly say goodbye to Elanie Lloyd and Amber Jones for the 2024 season.

The Family Fun Night, held in May to celebrate our volunteers, was a success, with food trucks, Kidz'n'Sport, and DJ. Ten tickets to the June long weekend West Coast Fever game were purchased as a prize for teams who registered to bring five or more players to the evening. The winners of the tickets were a very excited Go G2 team from Flames Netball Club. We raffled a Golden Parking Ticket at the event, and Clare Bond was the winner, generously donating it to another member. Walking Netball was also played during the night, which was thoroughly enjoyed by all.

We were successful in applying for a Neighbourhood Quick Response Grant of \$1,000 from City of Fremantle to support the event.

SPONSORSHIP & GRANTS

We welcomed MG Melville as a GOLD sponsor, with the commitment of \$80,000 being used toward much needed new uniforms over a 5-year partnership.

Thank you to Armando Sports for providing vouchers for the Most Valuable Player award recipient for each Association Championship team. Armando Sport also ran two FNA members discount weekends in April that provided members with significant store discount.

The Committee was very pleased to note that the Association's candidate for the Westfield Local Heroes Grant, Committee member Clare Bond, was successful in the popular vote, winning the major \$20,000 prize for inclusion and pathways at the Association. Congratulations to Clare on this fantastic achievement, and thanks to our FNA community for making it possible.

The Association's application for the Cultural Awareness Training & Cultural Activities Grant of \$1,000 from the City of Fremantle was successful, with more information expected soon from the City.

LIFE MEMBERS

A special presentation was made to Committee member, Clare Bond, on her successful voting-in to Life Membership to the Association.

The Life Members' afternoon tea was held on Grand Final day. This year we sadly farewelled two very valued life members, Margaret Young and Marjorie Green.

DEVELOPMENT

We ran our first selector workshop and expect this to continue yearly.

FNA had 19 teams representing us at the FTG&P Association Championships Teams with eight teams making finals and we came home with two wins.

Congratulations to our FNA athletes, Asha Parsons, Riley Burd, Indiana Squiers, Maya Kenny, Sophie Main and former FNA athlete Georgie Cleaver who were named in the State 19U Team, with Ava Robson named as a training partner, and Melanie Rainey the Assistant Coach. Indiana was

named as the Captain of the 19U side, and was further named in the 19U Australian Pathway Squad.

The state 17U team was represented by Sharks and FNA athletes Teagan Begovic and Kianah Davey, with Teddi Lowe named but unfortunately unable to participate.

Sharks Academy athletes Neve O'Sullivan and Chiara Finlay were selected in the School Sport WA 15U state team. Olivia Evans was selected in the School Sport WA 12U team. Zoe Spencer was an assistant coach of this team.

The Fever in Time Program, run by Netball WA, was a six session training program, with teams competing at State Cup in October. There were no Association-based 20U teams invited this year. Even with this being so, FNA was well represented at the competition, with the bulk of the players in the Metro South 16U1, 16U2, and 14U2 teams being FNA athletes.

aimed at further engaging those athletes who were not selected by Netball WA for Fever in Time.

UMPIRING

The Umpiring Committee was successful in obtaining a \$5,000 grant from Fremantle Ports, which was used to assist the growth and development of the Umpire Academy. FTG&P Association Championships, we had 22 umpires cover all FNA games, 6 Singapore teams, and RDNA No Limits covering over 160 games over the three days. A record 12 FNA umpires received a finals match appointment, the most of any Association, which is a great reflection of our umpire pathway and programs and the hard work of our umpires and coaches.

Our Junior Umpire Development Program had 40 umpires selected to participate during the Winter Competition, and the July School Holiday Umpire Program had 32 participants.

Our FNA umpires were awarded 49 National C Badges and one National B Badge. Five FNA umpires were a part of the WANL State Umpire squad and five umpires were selected into the Fever in Time program.

Australia 12U National Netball Competition in September. Congratulations to Madison Rogers for being appointed to umpire the gold medal match at the School Sport Australia 15U National Netball Competition in August.

The Sharks School Holiday Clinics held at FNA were thoroughly enjoyed by all participants who attended.

A total of 458 teams registered for the Winter Competition in 2023.

SPRING COMPETITION

Final registrations for the 2023 Spring competition was 156 teams and over 1300 players, up six teams on 2022:

- Open division: 24 teams
- 17U division: 32 teams
- Junior division: 56 teams
- Go division: 32 teams
- Set division: 12 teams

The Set and Go teams played in a round robin competition and experienced playing on hard courts. The Junior, 17U, and Open competitions were divisions of eight, with the top ranked team after the conclusion of matches being named the winner.

We had three timeslots, 4.15pm, 5.30pm and 7.00pm, with the two later timeslots full to capacity and the 4.15pm running alongside a hugely successful Net Program with an unprecedented 73 participants after registrations were re-opened due to popular demand.

The Spring Competition was advertised and available to participants of all genders, and it was possible to offer a combination of divisions both with mixed-gender and female-only teams. There was a very similar number of male players involved across all age groups in the 2023 Spring Competition compared to last year: 66 this year, and 63 in 2022.

GAYLE PASSMORE

It was an exciting and rewarding year for our development programs, with the Association trying new programs and courses, as well as taking on the WANL licence for the Sharks and working towards an aligned and connected pathway for our Fremantle athletes, coaches, and officials.

ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS

We had 19 teams representing Fremantle at the Fuel to Go & Play Association Championships in 2023, and experienced good success with eight teams making their division grand final and two achieving the win.

Our Opening Ceremony flag bearers this year were Ashley Speijers (Leeming Netball Club) from our 12U1 Team and Tiana Bussell (Rossmoyne Netball Club) from our 20U Team.

METRO DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

The Metro Development Program is a multi-Association initiative, aimed at bridging the development gap for athletes between Association Championships and State Cup. This year, the program included the entry of teams into the Southside Demons Carnival in August, as well as a six week competition rotating between FNA, Perth Netball Association, Southern Districts Netball Association, and Wanneroo Districts Netball Association.

FNA submitted two 12U, 14U, and 16U teams, plus one 20U team. The teams and their coaches had a successful and enjoyable experience at both the Demons Carnival and during the MDP Competition, with feedback from participants expressing enthusiasm about the purpose and success of the program.

FEVER IN TIME & STATE CUP

Players were invited to participate in this Netball WA program after being talent identified by selectors from March to June at the Developing Talent Challenge carnivals and the Fuel to Go & Play Association Championships.

State Cup took place at the Gold Netball Centre between 6 and 8 October 2023, with 26 Fremantle athletes selected to take part in the 14U and 16U Metro South teams, along with two FNA coaches. It was great for these athletes and coaches to get the exposure to this training and competition environment.

COACHING DEVELOPMENT

The Association ran three Club Coach Clinics in 2024:

I would like to thank Elanie Lloyd, Erica Miglori, Claire Adshead, Claire Ryan, and the Umpire Squad for their ongoing support and assistance in umpiring, coaching, badging, delivering programs and talent identification throughout the 2023 season and making my first year as AUDO so enjoyable. Thankyou to everyone on the FNA staff and Committee for all your input and assistance along the way. In a year heavily impacted by COVID-19, it was a huge team effort to make 2023 such a successful year.

JUNIOR UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

In 2023 40 beginner umpires participated in the Junior Umpire Development Program that was efficiently run by Erica Miglori and her team of umpire coaches. There were a record 17 National C Badges awarded during this program and three umpires were elevated into our 2023 Umpire Academy group. In October and November, we saw over 75 umpires trial for our 2024 program.

ADULT UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

In 2024, we saw ten umpires participate in this program. This program is targeted at any level umpire over the age of 18 to give people a safe and structured place to learn to umpire or develop their existing umpiring skills. Through this program we awarded three National C badges and had many of these participants umpire throughout the finals series.

UMPIRING WORKSHOPS

In 2023, the FNA Umpire Committee and Squad delivered ten workshops and visited multiple Clubs throughout the year to upskill umpires and umpire coaches in different areas of netball, including rules discussion, game management, and umpire coaching. We continue to look to expand these in 2024, especially with the implementation of the updated Rule Book.

METRO DEVELOPMENT UMPIRE PROGRAM

This year saw the inaugural year of the Metro Development Umpire Program run alongside the Metro Development Competition run as a collaboration between FNA, PNA, WDNA and SDNA. Clubs were asked to nominate their strongest umpires to be a part of this program, and we saw 13 umpires participating from Attadale, Bicton, Dalmatinac, Leeming, Melville Lakers, Tingara, and Willetton Netball Clubs.
