2018 Summary

- In 2018 we promoted True Sport values to our whole community. Supported by our clubs we were able to embrace these values. Teams, clubs, participants and officials worked together to create a fun, fair and safe environment for all to participate in netball at FNA. For all our hard work we won the inaugural 2018 Sport and Recreation Industry True Sport Award.
- Our 60-year-old building which housed the administration, hall and canteen was demolished after the season end and will be replaced by a brand-new purpose-built facility which is due to be completed prior to the start of the 2019 season. This has been made possible with a financial commitment from Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries.
- We were successful in securing a \$10,000 NWA Community Facilities Fund Grant which allowed us to cover part of the architectural costs for the new facility.
- Josh Wilson MP, Federal Member for Fremantle also supported FNA through a Stronger Communities grant which allowed us to replace all the globes on the upper courts.
- With the NWA Governance changes we saw the end of the Coastal Netball Regional and the introduction of the new WANL structure. FNA in partnership with East Fremantle Football Club were successful in securing a WANL Licence known as East Freo Sharks Netball - SHARKS.
- We continue to share our facilities with the community with various Primary and High School Carnivals being run at FNA; several Girls' colleges using the courts for their IGSSA competition and the Notre Dame University is using our facilities for their PE teaching degree program
- We held our eighth annual Club Forum Meeting in September with members from 20 clubs, Executive and Staff attending. An extensive agenda was presented with very successful and productive outcomes.
- We made the decision to have Clubs register players on My Netball which has led to extensive education in preparation and Clubs have embraced the new process. Particular thanks to Nicola Miller for championing the new process. This has led to a new score card size which has also been well received.
- We also introduced the new Net Set Go competition. This was a directive from Netball Australia.

New for 2019

- NWA will implement a new Regional Office Structure to provide associated servicing and activities. This will be partially funded from the increased NWA fee incorporating the 2018 Regional Fee.
- The new and improved Netball WA Competition Framework inclusive of substantial seed funding support to the seven newly-licensed WANL Clubs.
- The introduction of a Metro League Competition to be held within the metropolitan area commencing February. FNA were able to secure two 14-year-old teams, two 16-year-old teams, an 18U team and an Open team. These players will enjoy very reasonably priced new uniforms thanks to the new sponsorship agreement with Sports Centre watch this space for online supporters' merchandise for both Metro League and Rep Teams;
- Ongoing improvements to the Netball Australia Online Learning Platform, including education courses accreditation courses and workshops that form the backbone of our coach and officials development;
- Improved Association and Club education opportunities in the areas of Governance and Leadership, Association and Club development and Child Safeguarding;
- Ongoing development and enhancements to the MyNetball Platform, our National Database System;
- A reinvigoration of the Netball WA Pathway and associated programs across the player, coaching and officials' pathways.
- Increased support for Inclusion program opportunities across men and boys, CaLD communities, People with Disabilities, Aged participation etc.

3. COMPETITION REPORT- Jan Miles

REGISTRATION NUMBERS

Registrations in 2018 were 26 teams down on the 2017 numbers. The ages where we lost most teams were the F Grade from 2017 moving into Junior E, Junior D 2017 moving into Junior C. We did have a gain of teams into Junior A.

Grading 2018

19U/17U Divisions

This year we only had three clubs requesting 17U (1) and only two clubs requested 19U (1). When the grading committee selected the teams to make up the divisions to six teams the divisions appeared very unbalanced.

To try to make compatible and competitive divisions the grading committee took three 17U (1) teams, two 19U (1) teams and a 19U (2) to make a division which was felt to be a strong, competitive and compatible division. Also meaning that the less strong teams, who may otherwise have been shuffled up to the division 1s, did not have to play teams who were considerably stronger.

Regrading

FNA did not accept any requests for regrading in 2018. The Competition Coordinator monitored the competition for the first five weeks of the season to identify teams who had large wins or losses. The grading committee met and regraded teams where it was possible. The changes to grades and the effect on results for the regraded teams are summarised below:

- 17 & Under Grades: two teams were graded down and one team was graded up. Of the teams graded down one finished 5th and the other finished last in their divisions. The team which was graded up two grades due to very large wins finished last in their division.
- Junior D Grades: Of the teams which were graded up one finished in 4th place, and two finished in 5th place. Of the teams graded down one finished in 4th place, 1 in 5th place (in a division of 8) and one finished last.
- Junior E Grades: Of the teams which were graded up two finished in 1st place, one in 2nd place and one in 3rd place. Of the teams graded down one finished in 1st place, one finished in 3rd place and one finished 7th out of 8 teams and one team still did not have a win.
- Some changes were made to the Go divisions and whilst they do not play finals the majority of them had some better results in their new divisions.

Winter Competition

We had 36 clubs participating in our 2018 Winter Competition of which 21 clubs won at least one premiership. Cockburn and Rossmoyne were our most successful clubs with 6 premierships respectively. Winthrop NC won the SA1 division and the Most Valuable Player in the SA1 Grand Final was Eve Guelfi from Winthrop NC. Attadale won the Junior A1 Grand Final and the MVP for the Grand Final was Cleo Kenny from Attadale NC.

Junior Umpire Development Program (JUDP)

Selections for this program were run in line with the Rep team player trials in October and November 2017. 80 participants registered for the trials. 29 Umpires were identified for inclusion into the 2018 JUDP program.
