#### 1. PRESIDENT'S REPORT Sondra Anderson

2020 certainly is a year that we will never forget.

There have been many challenges and changes due to Covid-19. When Community Sport was thrown into turmoil in March we needed to act quickly and together if we were to have any chance of having a season at all. It was touch and go at many moments in the leadup to our season and I must thank and congratulate the Executive who worked together tirelessly to pull together the logistics of running a Winter season. With the best interests of our members in mind at all times, the countless rule changes from government and governing bodies required a huge commitment from all with lots of give and take. teams to warm up on court. With the late start to the season I think most people were thankful for the shorter game time. 12 National C badges, 1 National B Badge and 1 National A Badge were awarded to FNA umpires.

#### **Spring Competition**

Final registrations for the 2020 Spring competition were 130 teams (up 32 teams on 2019) consisting of 1 x Open division, 4 x 17U divisions, 11 x Junior divisions, 4 x Go divisions and 1 x Set division.

Go and Set were divisions of 8 where they played a round robin. The other 16 divisions were made up of 6 teams where they played each other once, a Semi Final (1 v 4 and 2 v 3) then winners of these games played in Grand Final. Two Junior divisions only had 4 teams so played each other twice then a Grand Final (1 v 2). We had 3 timeslots, 4.30pm, 5.30pm and 7.00pm.

#### 4. FNA REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS REPORT Sarah Dodd

Due to Covid-19, the 2020 Association Championships were held on the later than usual dates of 26<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> September 2020 at Perth Netball Association and the State Netball Centre. FNA entered 15 teams. The selection for our teams began in October 2019 via our phase 1 & 2 programs with teams selected following Phase 3 trials in February 2020. Our interrupted training program began and ceased in March, then recommenced in July for 10 weeks. Covid-19 meant there were many restrictions to be managed. For the first time our teams were split into two hubs (a morning and an afternoon session) at the weekend carnival.

2020 proved a very successful year for our Representative teams, with 7 teams making finals and all these teams won their grand final.

#### 5. PLAYER & COACH DEVELOPMENT REPORT Tania Plant (ADO) & Lisa Callaghan

Like everyone else 2020 presented a completely new set of challenges for development within our Association.

Thankfully we were able to run a Representative Team program, however the Metro League season was cut short and State Cup was cancelled.

Given our limited ability to further upskill athletes, coaches and umpires in 2020, this will be a focus for 2021. We will continue to grow our programs to keep up with always changing demands to our association.

#### **Talent Identification Program**

Our Talent Identification program ran throughout the shortened season. This is the main focal point of our talent identification process as it highlights athletes from all teams no matter what grade they play in throughout our winter competition.

Below are the 2020 numbers that were invited to trial for our main FNA representative program for the year – Association Championships which was hosted in September in 2020. From this TID program athletes are invited to other trials through the year such as State Cup and Metro League.

#### **Coaching Courses**

#### **FNA Holiday Clinic**

We were very pleased to be able to offer our FNA Holiday Clinic over two mornings during the July School Holidays. We had 157 attendees and they were looked after by 21 coaches who were either FNA Representative Team, Metro League or WANL athletes.

#### Net Set Go

A Net tier program for 5 to 7-year-old players was run alongside our Saturday competition. Net teaches fundamental motor skills and netball skills through dance, activities and games. In 2020 we had 36 participants who worked in groups of 8 to 10 players with two coaches per group. FNA had a fantastic set of enthusiastic coaches to assist these young players.

#### **METRO LEAGUE**

Fremantle Netball Association entered six teams into the 2020 Metro League competition. The weekly competition commenced in February 2020 at Perth Netball Association and the State Netball Centre but was unfortunately cut short and finished in March. 14U & 16U athletes were invited to trial if they had been a Rep Team player in 2019 and/or played for the Association in 2019 in Division 1 or 2. Some athletes who moved to FNA in 2020 were also invited to trial. For the 18U & Open trials athletes from our 2019 Winter competition in 17U1 & 2, 19U1 to 4 and SA1 to SA4 were invited to trial.
