# 2019 Summary

- With a demountable as our FNA office and the new building powering ahead, the start of 2019 was to say the least challenging.
- The inaugural **Metro League** competition kicked off in February with new uniforms (thank you to our new sponsor, Sports Centre), 6 FNA teams, coaches, managers, umpires and of course supported by admin and the Executive. Friday nights at Perth Netball Association and the State Netball Centre became a new normal. We trialled Metro League merchandise and everyone loved the hoodies, back packs, bags, beanies and caps.
- We welcomed Tania Plant as a Life Member at the AGM.
- Rep Team trials continued, and training commenced as we watched the final touches to the new building take shape. We moved in the Monday prior to the start of the Winter season and trialled the new facility with a 100-team school carnival on the Thursday.
- With the introduction of 7-year olds we had an increase in the number of teams for Winter and our community arrived at a **new purpose-built facility**. There was a real buzz whilst everyone found their way around. The canteen with its lower counter tops and barista coffee window were a hit and the TVs, with tables and chairs in the hall were a great place to have a coffee or lunch between games. First Aid worked well, and the post protector room meant everything had a home.
- The new position of the match office and the umpire window along with the score card collection system didn't take long for everyone to get used to.

- I could go on as I am thrilled with the new building and I would like to thank Buildwell for making this happen on time and on budget. The Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries again needs to be thanked and acknowledged for their \$1.8 million contribution. FNA members contributed \$440k toward our new home.
- The **FNA Representative Team Program** was a huge success with FNA securing the largest number of teams: 20. We finished the weekend with 9 Championship teams and 5 Runner up teams. Our umpires covered 133 games over the weekend with 8 FNA umpires covering grand finals. We had our first boy represent FNA in the 12U division.
- Our Opening, 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and Life Members were celebrated on the 23<sup>rd</sup> June. The Premier and Minister of Sport and Recreation, our Federal Members, Local Member and Mayor of Fremantle, Buildwell and Contractors, Life Members, new and older representatives from our Clubs, Staff and Executive all attended the event.
- We held our ninth annual **Club Forum** a very well attended meeting with robust discussion and exchange of ideas on matters at FNA.
- 40 National C badges and 3 National B Badges were awarded to FNA umpires.
- At the completion of the inaugural 2019 GIGWANL Season **East Freo Sharks Netball** Open team finished 3<sup>rd</sup> on the ladder, making it through to the semi-final and the 20U team finished 3<sup>rd</sup> on the ladder and made it one step further to the preliminary final. Congratulations!
- State Cup another first for 2019 with FNA submitting 8 teams across 12U, 13U, 14U and 16U, 4 of our teams played in the Grand Final with 3 winners. Thank you to Tania Plant for supporting yet another development program after such a busy year.
- Spring Netball was full within a week, 98 teams enjoyed Wednesday night netball under lights with music.
- Josh Wilson, MP for Fremantle has supported FNA again with \$15,000 through the Stronger Communities Program which will be used toward the shelter and seating.

# 5. PLAYER & COACH DEVELOPMENT REPORT Tania Plant & Lisa Callaghan

In 2019 our association had seen a huge change going from organising one FNA Representative program to running three across the full year. With the loss of the regions all associations were now responsible for further development of athletes with the introduction of two new competitions, Metro League and State Cup.

It has been recognised that with these significant changes we require further upskilling of athletes, coaches and umpires to cope with the three competitions spread across the year. This is something that we will be planning over 2020 and working towards so to grow our programs so to keep up with these new demands to our association.

The new competitions have been a wonderful opportunity for athletes that may not be able to be involved in the timeline of one of the FNA Rep Team competitions due to clashes with other sports or school, but the athlete can now select which competition they can trial for that suits their year schedule. It has also been also a great development tool for athletes that may make selection for one of the three competitions however may miss out on others through the constant development of athletes here at FNA. Trials are all separate and athletes must show at each trial their ability against their peers, every trial is a clean slate.

# **Talent Identification Program**

Our Talent Identification program that is run throughout the year is our main focal point as this highlights athletes from all teams no matter what grade they play in throughout our winter competition. Our process here is very thorough and we have been very pleased with witnessing some of our athletes coming from teams that are in the lower grades and boarding school teams that have had the opportunity to trial with others to make our 1<sup>st</sup> FNA Representative teams.

Below are the 2019 numbers that were invited to trial for our main FNA representative program for the year – Association Championships which is hosted in June. From this TID program athletes are invited to other trials through the year such as State Cup and Metro League.

# **Coaching Courses**

FNA host 3 coaching courses at the start of each year that is open to our members at a very reasonable cost. This is to encourage our club coaches and to help them with further skills to take back to their clubs, so they feel confident in their ability to create training sessions and run a skilled training session.

Clubs are always welcome to ask for assistance and feedback with further development of their coaches. FNA are always seeking club coaches to come on board with any of our representative teams so to learn new coaching skills and development so they can take this back to their own clubs and further develop their members and their own coaching pathway.

#### Net Set Go

A Net tier program for 5 to 7-year-old players was run alongside our Saturday competition. Net teaches fundamental motor skills and netball skills through dance, activities and games. In 2019 we had 28 participants who worked in groups of 8 to 10 players with two coaches per group. FNA had a fantastic set of enthusiastic coaches who were ably mentored by Deb Quan.

# METRO LEAGUE

Fremantle Netball Association entered six teams into the new Metro League competition offered by Netball WA. The weekly competition was played on Friday evenings at Perth Netball Association and the State Netball Centre in Wembley and ran from February to April. Trials were held in November of 2018 with our 14U & 16U athletes invited from past Rep team representatives and other Talent Identified athletes. Our 18U & Open players from 15U teams, 17U, 19U and SA1 to SA4 teams were invited to trial. A new Metro League uniform was designed with Metro League players buying their dresses.
