Junior Umpire Development Program

In 2025, 100 athletes registered for trials, this was narrowed down to 43 beginner umpires who participated in the Junior Umpire Development Program. These 43 participants were represented by 15 Clubs. In 2025 we saw 18 National C badges and four umpires elevated to our FNA Umpire Academy program. Erica Miglori, our development program coordinator, once again ran the program.

2025 saw participants move through the grades as their skill levels increased. Thank you to the coaches for their dedication to the program and contribution to the results achieved.

Adult Umpire Development Program

2025 was the fourth year running this program at FNA. This year we offered each Club one free position in the program; two clubs took this opportunity. Unfortunately, participant numbers decreased in 2025, with only 3 participants completing the program.

This program aims to upskill our Open division athletes and give the opportunity to umpires over 18 to develop their umpiring skills and provides clear pathways into our other development programs.

Metro Development Umpire Program

This year we ran our third year of our Metro Development Umpire Program alongside the 2025 Metro Development Competition (MDC). Umpires had access to theory sessions and player training sessions to upskill and were then allocated to games at the MDC. Participants in this program receive a TID and are nominated to join by Club Umpire Coordinators. This year we had 14 umpires from eight Clubs participate.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR PERIOD ENDED 31 DECEMBER, 2025

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (WA). The Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act (WA) and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AAS 1	Profit and Loss or Other Operating Statements.
AAS 3	Materiality.
AAS 8	Events Occurring After Reporting Date.

No other Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current values of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report:

- (a) **Income Tax**
The Association is an exempt body for income tax purposes.
Accordingly a provision for income tax is not required.
- (b) **Fixed Assets**
The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised at rates considered appropriate by the Committee. The carrying amounts of all fixed assets are reviewed annually by the Committee.
- (c) **Grants**
Grants received for asset improvement programs are accounted for based on a Capital Offset basis.
The grant funds are not considered as income rather offset against the asset capital costs in the balance sheet, and amortised over the life of the asset/s acquired with the grant funds.
- (d) **Inventories**
Inventories consist of certain stock and are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a specific identification basis.

Qualified Auditors Opinion


